



***Yazzie/Martinez* Tribal Infrastructure Remedy Framework:
 Extended Student Services: After School, Summer School and At-Risk Student Support**

The following proposed one time investment for essential education infrastructure projects was developed by Tribal Librarians responding to HM 106 and other similar requests over the years by the legislature to assess the needs of Tribal Libraries. The Tribal Librarians were supported by the Tribal Libraries Program, New Mexico State Library, School of Architecture, Indigenous Planning and Design, University of New Mexico and Suina Design Architects of Albuquerque, New Mexico. The recommendations are supported by Tribal and Pueblo Leaders reflected by resolutions enacted as part of a formal process engaging the All Pueblo Council of Governors, Jicarilla Apache Tribal Council, Mescalero Tribal Council and the Navajo Nation, Office of the President and Diné Department of Education and Tribal Delegates.

The education infrastructure investment includes Tribal Libraries, Education Resource Centers, Curriculum Development Centers, and Early Childhood Education Centers. The appropriation requests include planning, design, expansion, renovation, new construction, and equipment. These one-time investment is a response to the Findings in *Yazzie/Martinez* to house community based programs to support to “Extended Student Services: after school and summer programs.”
